ENSURE A FUTURE FOR THE CRANES

In March each year, the cranes arrive in Nebraska and hundreds of thousands of them come to the historic prairie that is protected by the Crane Trust. These cranes come, as they have for a million years to this stretch of the river to roost and to increase their body weight for the remainder of their 5000 mile migration where they lay their eggs and raise their young. This piece of the historic Platte River is critical to the health and growth of the sandhill cranes. "The annual Sandhill Crane migration is one of the world's greatest natural spectacles," said a Wall Street Journal writer. We now estimate that the sandhill crane migration may be as large as 800,000 birds an amazing number and it's partly due to the work of the Crane Trust and other conservation organizations.

The Crane Trust has been protecting land along this vital part of the Platte River for 40 years. The Trust has permanently protected nearly 25,000 acres along this small part of the river but our work to see that the cranes have a permanent place to rest and feed is not

done. The Trust owns seven miles of the north side of the river and this
land will always be available to the cranes to feed and rest here in central Nebraska. We have now turned our attention to the other side of the river because as you look out of our blinds at this magnificent migration in most cases the land on the other side is not protected. If a housing development or a gravel pit was developed on that land it would permanently destroy this roost forever.

Our "South Side Vision" is to protect this critical habitat as we have on the north side. This will provide a home for the cranes for as long as time exists. You can help, we have made our first purchase of 260 acres and also a conservation easement on another piece but there are miles to go.

We need your help and we need it now, its possible someone is planning a development at this moment and unless we act to protect the land soon, the migration and our habitat might be negatively impacted forever. Your support of the Crane Trust will see that the cranes have a permanent home, somewhere where they will be able to stop, rest and feed for generations to come. Please help, the migration depends on it. Cindy and I were touched by the beauty of the Crane Trust, the amazing migration, and the work they have done to protect this important piece of Nebraska. Their work to protect the south side of the Platte River may be more important than anything they have done in their 40 year history. We should all help if we can.
